Dr. Anwar Alroomi and Dr. Tzong-Ying K. Hao, both Assistant Professors of Civil Engineering and Construction Management at CSUN, will speak to us at our October meeting. Both Dr. Alroomi and Dr. Hao received Outstanding Engineering Achievement Merit awards from the San Fernando Valley Engineering Council last February.



Dr. Alroomi will speak on her experiences being a woman in engineering and how to attract more girls to Engineering. This is a timely topic due to AAUW's recently released report "Solving the Equation: The Variables for Women's Success in Engineering and Computing." This report asks why there are still so few women in the critical fields of engineering and computing — and explains what we can do to make these fields open to and desirable for all employees.

Dr. Hao will share her experience in supporting women engineering students, as well as her thoughts about the movie "San Andreas," which relates to her research in Earthquake Engineering.
