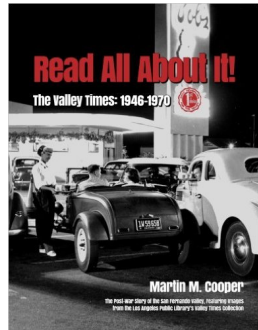
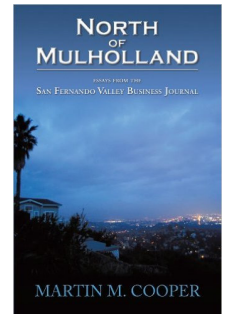


## SFV History

Marty Cooper, historian and author of a book on the San Fernando Valley's history, will speak to us about the role that women played in the history of the Valley.



Mr. Cooper is a long-time observer of the Valley scene, having lived in the San Fernando Valley since 1970 and operated his marketing and public relations firm here since 1982. He has written two books about the Valley, *North of Mulholland* and *Read All About It! The Valley Times 1946-1970*. For nearly seven years, he was a regular columnist for the *San Fernando Valley Business Journal* and has more than 50 articles published in everything



from the *Warner Center News* to the *Wall Street Journal*. He teaches marketing, strategic planning and public relations at UCLA and was the 2011 UCLA Extension Distinguished Instructor of the Year.
