

Homeplace: A Site of Racism and Patriarchy

Our January meeting will be a presentation by AAUW Fellow La Toya Council. Council is a PhD candidate in Sociology at USC. She will be presenting her current research project which examines work, family, and self-care practices among heterosexual Black middle-class couples.



The prevailing understanding of the division of labor in heterosexual dual-earning households is that women are still subject to the second shift (cooking, cleaning, and house organizing) compared to men. Council's research explores how gender intersects with race in the shaping of household dynamics.

Division of labor has long been a topic of great interest to AAUW, but little has been done to explore how race bears on the topic. Council's presentation will be a fascinating look into an aspect of gender bias to which our members have little exposure.
